Similarly, parents or caregivers abuse or neglect children, they may develop immoral or impulsive behaviors (Child Welfare Information Gateway).

PEER INFLUENCE

During the adolescent years, peer inspirations play an important role in teenagers' choices. Because peer acceptance is a crucial part of most teens' sense of self and increasing need to separate from the family system, adolescents sometimes base their choices on their friends' opinions, rather than what is morally right or responsible (American Psychological Association).
