In this modern period, even a financially, physically and mentally prosperous man is surrounded by many problems. In such a situation, when a normal person is tired, it is natural for a disabled person to feel stressed or dipressed by various problems in life. Hence, it becomes necessary to study the social, socio-economic and cultural problems of disabled students. Parents do not send their children to school for study due to the fear that their child will be disgraced in the society, thus the situation becomes more serious. Hence it becomes necessary to study the challenges faced by disabled students in school. This is an attempt to know what these challenges might be as a student.

# **Scope and Sample Selection:**

The present research was conducted considering the problems of students with disabilities in Gandhinagar schools. Therefore, students with disabilities studying in disability schools of Gandhinagar became the scope for the present research. But due to limitation of time, energy and money it was not possible for the researcher to carry out the research on the whole scope of research. So the question of selecting a sample from the scope arose before the researcher. The researcher has selected the sample through purposive sampling method, in which a total of 60 students of two disabled schools of Gandhinagar have been taken as a sample.

#### **Tool designing**

Under the present research, the researcher at the initial stage, keeping in mind the first two objectives, obtained information through interview to find out the number of students studying in the Divyang (disabled) school of Gandhinagar. To know the different problems experienced by the disabled students under the research, the researcher designed a questionnaire for the disabled students. This questionnaire had two main sections. Nine sub-sections were formed under the first section of the questionnaire, under which a total of 46 questions were included to which students with disabilities had to answer in the form of yes or no. While the second section of the questionnaire for students with disabilities included three open-ended questions.


#### Method of data collection

In the first phase, the researcher tried to get information about the number of schools in Gandhinagar area where students with disabilities are studying. For this, the researcher directly visited such schools and obtained the information of the disabled students from the principals. In this way, the first stage of data collection was done and based on this, a data of the disabled students studying in which schools could be obtained.

After defining the sample, in the second stage, the researcher visited the school included in the sample and collected information from the disabled students of that school through a questionnaire. The necessary information for the questionnaire was obtained by visiting in person.

Analysis and interpretation of general information obtained from students A table showing percentage of socialproblems faced by disabled students: \_ Being Loved in society compared to other individuals




Do you like that ordinary people show compassion toyou as disabled?



Can people understand your feeling?



Does Society respect/ felicitate students on receiving education?



Do you get normal life like any ordinary person?




During study in the classroom do you experience mental stress?

Due to disability do you face any concentration trouble?



Do you fear people will laugh on your disabilities?



Do you feel shame and hesitation due to disability?



Do you get angry frequently due to disabilities?




Do you feel happy on seeing disabled kids like you?


Problems in learning Does disability affect the learning process?




Do you feel shame and hesitation during group learning?



# **Academic Implications:**

An humble attempt has been made here by the researcher to show some important implications from the findings obtained in the context of the present research. present research.

- 1 . Latest libraries available in schools are very important in the educational progress of learning by disabiled in schools. But from the present research it was found that the curriculum related textbooks, charts and diagrams to cater to the disabilities of students are not available in the schools . As the situation is considered serious , it is suggested here that all necessary efforts should be made to make available textbooks suitable for the disabled students in the schools.
- 2. Whether the child is normal or disabled, he should be accepted by all. Being accepted in the society, every person lives his life with self-respect and happiness. But through the present research it was revealed that the disabled students were being ignored by the society due to their own physical defects. So it is to be noted here that the society should consider the disability of a child as an additional feature and should take note of their existence in an acceptable manner.
- 3. Through the present research, it has been revealed that in most of the schools in Gandhinagar there is no availability of psychiatrists or such counsellors, this condition is not acceptable. Many psychological questions arise in the mind of students studying in school. In addition to this the questions of disabled students are special. In our perspective, the present research leads to a very important and useful educational result that psychological counsellors should be appointed in every school.
- 4. It was found that the financial assistance provided by the government to the majority of the disability schools was not sufficient. It is desirable that the government should provide adequate financial assistance to disabled students to study in the school.

#### **Conclusion**

The present research is only partial. It is a deep belief that the results of the present research will be useful to the concerned people if they undertake several such researches from time to time. At the end of the present study, the researcher feels a deep sense of satisfaction. In particular, this study humbly believes that the research will be an appropriate guide for school administrators, principals, teachers and parents of students with disabilities.
